



Feed the Future Bangladesh Aquaculture and Nutrition Activity




Background

Feed the Future Bangladesh Aquaculture and Nutrition Activity is a five-year (2018–2023) project led by WorldFish and funded by USAID. It falls under the United States Government's global hunger and food security initiative, Feed the Future, and aims to sustain positive aquaculture sector growth in the Feed the Future Zone of Influence and the Resilience Focus Area.

The Activity builds on the achievements of the six-year Aquaculture for Income and Nutrition project, which saw the livelihoods of smallholder fish farmers improve through increased production and quality of tilapia, carp, shrimp and prawn.

Activity Working Area




Goal & Objectives

The goal is to achieve inclusive aquaculture sector growth through a market system approach.


The specific objectives are:
